Bond Construction Set For Summer



We greatly appreciate the trust and support of the community with the passing of the 2021 Bond Proposal that will result in the replacement of boiler systems, classroom heating units across the district, Yale Junior High (YJH) roof, YJH classroom floors, YJH doors, and much more. As you may recall, the scheduled bond work was delayed due to supply chain constraints and delays that may have jeopardized the junior high being open in late August.

The district has been working with contractors and finalizing our plans to begin the work this summer. We elected to split the building work into two summers (2023 and 2024) and prioritized Yale Junior High for this summer. If you are on the main campus this coming summer, you'll see a great deal of work being done in and around Yale

Junior High.

The community has also supported Sinking Funds that allow us to complete various maintenance projects every year. This past summer, sinking funds were used to replace the roofs at Yale Elementary and Farrell Elementary. Additionally, sinking funds were used to seal and stripe parking lots at Avoca and Yale Junior High. We plan to use these sinking funds this summer for a partial roof replacement at Avoca, bathroom partition replacement at Yale High School, and much more. The district has studied the age and structures around the building and have created a prioritized list that gets re-evaluated every year. This is all possible because of the support and trust of our community

Yale Students Best in County & Region on Several Tests

Yale students have done exceptionally well on state and national assessments that are required each year across the state. Students in third through seventh grade are tested using Michigan's Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP). Students in eighth through tenth grade complete the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) and students in eleventh grade take the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). We are very proud of the academic achievement of our students under the direction of our outstanding staff.

Out of the 60+ districts in St. Clair, Genesee, Lapeer, Macomb, and Sanilac Counties, Yale is:

- ⇒ First in 5th, 7th, 8th grade ELA on M-STEP
- ⇒ Second in 4th & 5th grade ELA on M-STEP
- ⇒ Third in 3rd, 4th grade ELA on M-STEP
- ⇒ Fifth in 8th grade Math on M-STEP
- ⇒ Sixth in 7th grade Math on M-STEP

In St. Clair County:

⇒ First in 8th, 9th grade Math and ELA on PSAT





Elementary Hands-on Learning

Our elementary students are loving the hands-on learning activities, projects, and problems that build upon each other and relate to real world applications. In the last two years, we have placed an even greater emphasis on creating more of these authentic opportunities for students in science classes at the elementary level using a program

called Project Lead the Way. These hands-on projects or modules have many math, engineering, science, and English components embedded in them. Often the students are presented with a problem and they must design and/or engineer a solution with a few limited materials. Often this work is done in collaborative groups so students also learn and apply team

Our fall sports season was very successful both in terms of achievement on the field of competition and also in the classroom. With over one hundred sixty high school students competing in cross country, football, soccer, volleyball, golf, and tennis our student athletes were busy! Our boys cross country team earned their sixth straight BWAC title and also earned academic all state status. Our football team

earned a trip to the playoffs for the first time since 2018 and also earned academic all state status this year. In addition to our high school athletes we also had just over one hundred junior high student athletes representing our school this fall. We believe in the value of educational athletics as a continuation of the lessons learned in the classroom and look forward to a successful winter sports season ahead!

Security Upgrades at YPSD

Over the last several months, the district has increased the number of safety measures in place to keep our students and staff safe each day. There is an increased police presence each day as the Yale Police Department continues to provide support to our schools. This has also included some visits to Avoca and Farrell by our school resource officer Jodi Soucy. Presently the district has Officer Soucy two to three days per week and we are actively pursuing grants to extend her time in the district.

Additionally, our staff have reviewed safety protocols and practiced various scenarios using the ALICE and CRASE responses to intruders being on our campus. Through the school safety grant, we have installed the Nightlock secure door barricades and will be improving our secure keyless entry into each building over the next month. The district invited the Department of Homeland Security and St. Clair County Emergency Response teams to evaluate what we can do to further secure our buildings this fall. It is our belief that these measures make our buildings safer, but we need your continued support and cooperation each day. Our staff may ask for identification, ask questions about a visitor's reason for arriving at a building, and more.

Computer Science Expands Across the District

Computer Science is now the most common language used across the globe in countless aspects of our lives. In our digital society, much of what we do depends on functioning technology that is embedded with code that tells the computer or device to complete a task. In Yale, we are committed to offering students more experiences with computer science and 'coding' beginning in elementary school. Our technology teacher, Mrs. Pung, has students experiment with different coding platforms before students move on to the junior high and high school for more extensive exploration and study.

At the secondary level students have the chance to begin writing computer programs, such as the work being done in Mrs. Morgan's class at Yale Junior High. Students have been working to complete several tasks including developing a better understanding of hardware and writing code for simple games or applications (apps). At the December Board of Education meeting, Ms. Morgan had a few students present what they have learned in their junior high computer science courses. Our impressive young Bulldogs gave Board members a quick tour of the programming they have created and







Alumni Luncheon


